Many images are copyright protected and require permission to use. To find images that are in the public domain (free to use), use the Advanced Search feature in Google, Bing, etc and select usage rights that are free to use or share or images in the Public Domain.

Search [FLICKR using Creative Commons](#) license to suit your project.

Search [Bing – run your search then limit by license.](#)

Search [Creative Commons. Select "modify, adapt, or build upon."](#)

Search [Pixaby](#) Over 770,000 free stock photos, free of copyright restrictions

Search United States Government sites. Many items are public domain and free to use

In-text citation: (appears under the image)

(Author last name, year)

Reference page entry:

Owner/author. (role of the owner/author). (year image was created). *Title of image in italics.*
[type of work - photograph, painting, outdoor mural]. Retrieved from URL

GOOGLE IMAGES

How do you cite an image from Google Images? Simple. **You do not.**

Google Images is a search for images, not the owner of the images. You must find the original owner of the image and cite that information. In Google Images there is a link to the right of the image that says “visit page” that may take you to the original source. If this does not give you enough information to cite correctly, you will need to find another more credible image.
